1. **Call to order and Election of Officers**; Commissioner Lamar moved and the motion was seconded, "that the following slate of officers for 2014 be accepted".

- 4. **Minutes** for the **November 18, 2013, Meeting** were **Approved** as distributed.
- 5. Administrative/Financial Matters:
- **5.1 Commissioner's Comments:**
- 5.1.1 Commissioner Lamar introduced the NONNAN RESOLUTION which he will sent to the US Attorney...See Exhibit A
- 5.1.2 **Embassy/Mission Property Update**: Following Commissioner Lamar's 2013 update on various properties the Commissioners have worked with Pat Elwood (Director, Office of Protocol and International Affairs; Office of the Secretary of the District of Columbia; Executive Office of the Mayor) in an attempt to corrected the various identified issues. Following is an update of her efforts.

ALBANIA: A sign was posted saying "No Parking" in the driveway. The property was cleaned up and the Ambassador is really hoping his New Year's present will be enough money from his government to fix the building. Are you still seeing cars parked in the driveway? If so, they are doing so without permission. We will continue to work on this, as is needed and appropriate. The Ambassador is being very co-operative.

<u>PAKISTAN</u>: R Street. The State Department Office of Foreign Missions is engaging them on various issues. They have approved their request to rent out that property commercially. This may give them the impetus to finish the renovation so it is in rentable condition and we will continue to stay engaged and updated regarding this.

<u>DOMINICAN REPUBLIC</u>: Problem of parking on the sideway and driving on the curb. We are looking into what we can do regarding problems; and the Department of State is supporting

enforcement of DC's laws and regulations. We will write an official letter of complaint to the Department of State – OFM. Feel this might be just a matter of enforcing parking rules that are already in place and, barring that, a talk by us with the Ambassador.

<u>SERBIA</u>: Regarding cleaning up the yard and fencing issue. We will write a letter of complaint to OFM and continue to work with them on this issue. <u>ARGENTINA</u>: 2136 R Street, NW. We discovered that this has not been a tax-exempt diplomatic property for many years (20+). The Argentine military maintains it and pays taxes. There is no law

That requires someone to inhabit a property they own; but it should be properly maintained.

MAURITANIA: Wall on S Street. Office of Foreign Missions on S Street has explained that Mauritania is having difficulty getting funds from their capital to repair it. After a meeting with OFM complaining about this issue, we were told that they (OFM) would call about it in hopes of having the Embassy repair this wall soon. They, you and we will check periodically and we (OFM and we) will contact the embassy for updates.

MOLDOVA: Rats and clean up. We feel our combined efforts with the Embassy have achieved the clean-up. DC authorities were contacted and have now become involved with the restaurant in that alley regarding the rat problem and the remediation on that should have started shortly after our meeting".

Three additional projects not included in Ms. Elwood's report:

Not included in the update is the <u>Egyptian Military</u> property at 2308 Tracy, however, it remains as a priority in our discussions.

<u>CHINESE EMBASSY</u> has finished the easement agreement with Portugal Embassy. The project could start within Feb, 2014, and the term is about 30 months after kicking off. I will send you a detailed construction schedule for your reference as we finalize it.

Embassy of France Ambassador's Residence The project has been reviewed by both the DC Historic Preservation Office and the Commission of Fine Arts and has received staff level approval from both. The building permit was submitted to DCRA this week. The scope of the project is primarily interior work to modernize the building systems of the residence and there will be no change in occupancy or function. The minor site changes are to improve access to the main entrance with the addition of a ramp, to better manage deliveries and trash with a service ramp and trash room at the east service drive, and to provide a site generator. Additionally, safety concerns around the site have been addressed with repairs at the pool, repair of stone steps, and the addition of handrails and balustrades at the rear of the building. Please see below for a more detailed description of this work. The project is currently out to bid with construction slated to begin in early February and end in October. Some preliminary demolition work has begun to prepare the building for the main renovation project. Site utility connections will be required in public space; these will occur in compliance with DC regulations. Otherwise, construction activities will be contained within the site and with minimal impact to the neighborhood.

- 5.2 **Treasurer's Report:** Treasurer Lamar reported that the current balance in the ANC's checking account is \$2,309.24.
- 5.3 **Security Fund Participation:** Commissioner Lamar moved and the motion was seconded, "that the Commissioners of ANC 2D, meeting on January 13, 2014, approve the ANC's participation in the Advisory Neighborhood Commissions Security Fund and authorizes the Treasurer to pay the \$25.00 fee for the period January 1, 2014 through December 31, 2014. The Chairperson and Secretary are authorized to execute the necessary agreements. **Approved**
- 5.4 **Meeting Cancellation Policy**; Commissioner Bender reminded the residents that it is the **Policy (Approved 1-23-12)**"that ANC 2D and any of its committees, task forces or any other group will not meet on any day when the District Government is closed due to inclement weather or other emergency situations".
- 5.5 **Bank Signatories**; Commissioner Lamar moved and it was seconded "that since the officers are remaining the same, Bank Signatories (Bender/Lamar) will remain as on file with the Dupont Circle branch of the PNC Bank.

9.1 Winter Weather Safety and Preparedness Tips from

DPW: Property owners are asked to treat their sidewalks with an abrasive such as non-clumping kitty litter, a deicer or rock salt. This snow season, the Snow Team is testing the effectiveness of pet-safe deicer on bridges with pedestrian sidewalks. Motorists are asked to clear all snow from the vehicle first then drive cautiously. Assist elderly or disabled neighbors with clearing their sidewalks. Also, for plow drivers' safety, "Don't crowd the plow." Residents are encouraged to go to snow.dc.gov for updates before, during and after winter storms, and for tips to get one's home and family prepared for inclement weather. Residents also may sign up at alert.dc.gov to receive emergency alerts and notifications from Alert DC. <u>DC law requires property owners to clear snow and ice from sidewalks, handicap ramps and steps on their property within the first eight daylight hours after the snow, sleet or ice stops falling.</u>
